Scientific Background

Severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus-2 (SARS-CoV-2) remains the most rapidly spreading disease since 2020. The spike glycoprotein (S) of coronavirus, a type I transmembrane protein containing two subunits \$1 and \$2, facilitates viral genome entry into the host cells through the interaction with angiotensin-converting enzyme 2 (ACE2) (1). In November 2021, the heavily mutated SARS-CoV-2 variant B.1.1.529 was first identified in South Africa. The World Health Organization (WHO) named this variant Omicron and designated it as a variant of concern (VOC) due to its high infection and reinfection risks (2). As more variants of the virus emerge, it is pivotal to study the transmissibility, virulence, and their possible tendency to escape antibody neutralization of the virus (3).
